Sports Development Program (SDP)

SEDA College partners with major sporting brands and organisations that facilitate real life industry experiences and student opportunities. The Program immerses students in industry through unique inductions, community events and work placements. The Victorian Certificate of Education – Vocational Major (VCE VM) and Vocational Education and Training (VET) are the two qualifications completed in the program. These provide students with the acquisition of skills that will support future educational and employment pathways.

High Performance Program (HPP)

Building and Trade Program (B&T)

The Building and Trade Program is specifically designed for students who want to develop the skills and knowledge needed to gain an apprenticeship in the Building and Construction industry. The program immerses students in industry, exposing them to multiple trades through practical and industry experiences. The Victorian Certificate of Education – Vocational Major (VCE VM) and Vocational Education and Training (VET) are the two qualifications completed in the program. These provide students with the acquisition of theoretical and practical skills that will support their future educational and employment pathways into the Building and Construction Industry.






CLASSROOM VENUES

LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

The SEDA College difference

The number one factor attributed to positive student outcomes is the teacher. Our 'one teacher, one classroom' model enables our teachers to take on a true mentoring approach.

Our teachers will walk alongside and support the individual journey of our students as they complete their secondary education. SEDA College teachers are experts in developing and maintaining positive teacher-student relationships.

Mentor-style relationships are formed between teachers and students through their shared passions and interests. This mutual connection enhances the bond our students have with their class and the school as a whole.

As part of the annual school fees, each student receives a laptop enabling access to the curriculum for the year ahead and their SEDA College uniform.

In addition, the College has well developed support services available for all students. These include:

Education Engagement Assistant (EEA)

Two days a week an additional staff member is in the classroom to assist individualised student learning.

They work with students who need to be extended academically and those that require additional academic support.

Student Connect (Wellbeing)

SEDA College has in place a team to support students with any wellbeing issues. They work with external practitioners and organisations to ensure all students have access to the best options available.

We have integrated the learnings of Positive Education into the College program. Applying the philosophies of The Resilience Project (Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness), in conjunction with our own "Winning Your Wellbeing Program", enables a wellbeing focus in the day to day learnings of our students.

Pathways (Career Planning)

The College Pathways team works individually with each student to educate and help them develop their pathway opportunities. This is done through supporting the Structured Workplace Learning process and identifying possible education and employment pathways.

MySEDA

MySEDA is the Learning Management System (LMS) that students, parents and staff use as their central hub for communication, teaching and learning. MySEDA supports parents and guardians to stay connected with real-time access to student assessment, grades, reports, industry experiences and important notifications. It is accessible on all devices.

VCE VM STUDY AREAS

Student learning

SEDA College students engage in Study Areas that provide context and enhance learning through their interest in sport and recreation.

The Apprentice

In this study area, students complete structured work placements (SWL) in a suitable vocational industry as well as class based investigations into the work environment.

Over the course of their time at the College, students are encouraged to explore the value of volunteering with our sporting partners, to build their resume and connect with key professionals.

Healthy Living

What it takes to live a healthy life is the focus of this study area, as students explore the physical, mental, and social aspects of wellbeing. Topics in the study area reflect the contemporary world and may include a focus on respectful relationships, mindfulness, healthy eating and the misinformation that can affect healthy choices and self esteem.

The Power of Sport

The Power of Sport has students examine how sport influences the community and how it can shape culture and bring people together. In this study area students are responsible for designing and running community based projects that link with local community groups.

On the Road

On the Road explores all that is involved in purchasing and running your first car. Budgets, income, loans and insurance are just some of the considerations students will be asked to think about as they make real life decisions that relate to their personal and financial circumstances.

The Promoter

Students will begin by looking at what it means to advocate for a person, product, club, or cause. The case studies may include athletes, products, sporting clubs and specific causes that have used sport as a platform. Students will analyse a variety of texts to understand the ways public profiles are developed and how these may be catered for particular kinds of audiences.

The Inner Sanctum

Students will learn about communication strategies used by clubs. This will include player contracts, strategic plans, codes of conduct and the use of the public communication such as media and press conferences. Students will craft their own public messages to promote their club or organisation.

Sporting Cultures

Students will study how sports organisations set and communicate team culture, they will examine sporting scandals to understand social values, and explore the impact of breaches. They will also look at fairness and inclusion measures and related campaigns.

VET Qualifications


Develop the skills and attributes needed to teach sport skills to a wide variety of people. Access SEDA's industry experts and sporting partners to gain a greater understanding of coaching principles and the development of coaching sessions. In Year 11 and Year 12 students undertake VET qualifications in sport, recreation and aquatics, providing the opportunity to gain experience in a variety or areas within the industry.

VCE VM subjects may be integrated across the study areas. This model of delivery provides students with the opportunity of exploring industry and vocational themes across the traditional disciplines to develop knowledge and skills in an inter-disciplinary manner that reflects real world environments. For example, Literacy and Work Related Skills may be delivered in The Apprentice, combining the reading, and writing of workplace communications with the practical knowledge of OHS and application through sourcing a work placement or entry level employment.

Fit for Work

This Study Area is designed to build student knowledge and skills in managing their own mind and body for the demands of the Building and Construction industry. Students are exposed to a range of resources relating to exercise, nutrition and mental health to help them develop a holistic approach to coping in a physically demanding work environment.

The Apprentice

The students' work placements and the structured workplace learning (SWL) that ensues, informs this integrated Study Area. Students explore their career pathways in real work settings and acquire transferrable skills that employers value. Students explore the value of volunteering, while building their resume and connecting with key professionals in their chosen industry.

SWL provides students with a hands-on learning experience one day a week from Term 2 onwards. Students record their experiences on placement; develop workplace documents such as emails, resumes and cover letters; and participate in mock interviews to gain an indepth understanding of workplace expectations.

Design and Build

We encourage students to create projects for themselves and the community using a broad range of trade skills like plastering, bricklaying, carpentry and wall and floor tiling. Students will study both traditional and contemporary

approaches to building and learn how to use emerging technologies.

There is a focus on 'Green Building' and the need for creating environmentally friendly living spaces. They will get the chance to examine 5-Star Rating Systems in the Building and Construction industry.

Smart Business

This Study Area focuses on developing leadership and management skills. Students will learn a variety of skills ranging from developing a business proposal to starting and running a business. We will help students develop the skills to manage both their time and money.

Out and About

We recognise the need for SEDA College students to grow and develop in the areas of communication, problem-solving and teamwork. We want to empower them to be global citizens and find innovative solutions to problems. For this study area, students will undertake activities including building and repair work, teaching skills to children or organising community projects.

VET Qualifications (Building and Construction)

Develop the skills and attributes needed to work in the Building and Trade industry. In Year 11 students complete units in a variety of areas such as Carpentry, Plumbing, Electrical and Bricklaying before completing a full Certificate II in Building and Construction in Year 12.

The Building and Trade Program is designed to give students a chance to study subject areas relevant to their interests. They attend SEDA College five days a week and are in a class that includes both Year 11 and 12 students. Students would follow a weekly timetable similar to that shown below.



We hold an Orientation Day in November where students meet their teacher and peers at their new classroom venue.


